Microplastic sampling



Write out your sampling strategy:

Steps for sampling microplastics

- 1. Decide where you want to sample from your Arctic region. Record a description of the sample in your data table.
- 2. Extract the ice sample from the tray using a spoon. Crush the ice using your hands, carefully keeping all the pieces of microplastic.
- 3. Label a piece of filter paper with the sample number. Continue to crush the ice sample and collect the microplastic pieces on the filter paper.
- 4. Count the number of microplastics in the sample. Record the number in your data table.
- 5. Repeat the steps with each of your samples.
- 6. Then use the quantity of microplastics you found in your samples to help you estimate the total quantity of microplastics in your Arctic region. Remember you sampled only a small part of your region, so you'll have to do some calculations to estimate the amount of microplastics in the region.
